YOUR BENEFITS:

- All-night armed security patrols by Smith Patrol (members know when).
- Members receive Smith's late night dispatch number. Add this to your cell phone, and during patrol hours, you can call them direct if you want to report something. If you're away from home and receive an alarm notification during their patrol hours, call Smith Dispatch to have it checked out.
- Members can request added surveillance when out of town.

The 5 Star ENP is separate from our Neighborhood Association, but we work closely together. The Churchill Way Patrol, north of Forest Lane, is managed by Hillcrest Forest. Paid Hillcrest Forest members in that area will receive information on the Churchill Way Patrol.

A national apartment builder proposes to replace the 2-story offices called the Concourse Office Park, on the south LBJ service road at Hughes Lane, between Hillcrest and Preston Roads. It adjoins the Preston Citadel neighborhood, which extends from Churchill Way to LBJ. They plan to build 430 apartments, 7 stories.

Bruce Wilke, president of Hillcrest Forest, and Carol Scott, representing Preston Citadel, conveyed their concerns to the developers -- about the density of apartments, and also the inevitable 24/7 apartment traffic cutting through the neighborhood to Preston Road, to reach the Preston Forest shopping center or go north on Preston to turn west on LBJ. The only alternative to them using our residential streets is to go a mile out of their way, east on the LBJ service road to Hillcrest Road and then back to Preston.

FROM PRESIDENT BRUCE WILKE Recycling - "If in doubt, throw it out"

You may have heard that China no longer accepts recycling, and China was the major buyer. Luckily, Dallas has alternatives.

The bad news is that a lot of our recycling still ends up in the landfill. A large part of it is contamination from food residue. Not only does that item have to be pulled out of the recycling stream for disposal, but it often contaminates clean paper and cardboard in the truck.

Another big problem is "wish-cycling", where residents put items in their bin that cannot be recycled. The city says that it's well-intended but does more harm than good. It costs the city money to sort it out and dispose of it. They say, "If in doubt, throw it out."

Other tips: Big Blue container lids must always be closed so rain cannot enter. Rain ruins the paper products, and water in the bin can damage items when dumped in the truck. Also, flatten boxes to conserve space.

And finally, items should be loose in the bin. Collect your recycling in a trash bag if you want, but then empty it into the bin. Closed trash bags have to be pulled from the conveyor belt at the center and opened by hand, adding labor expense and disrupting the flow.

The DALLAS POLICE ask us, "Please...



Preston Royal Book Club Sponsored by the Preston Royal Library and the Hillcrest Forest Neighborhood Association

Everyone is welcome to join us & discuss the books the members have chosen. For information, go to HillcrestForest.org and click "Book Club"!

We receive occasional reports of bulky trash being put out too early. It can happen to anyone once in a while, but if someone is a regular offender, you can call 3-1-1 and file a report with the City.

Volume is now limited to 10 cubic yards per month. This is equivalent to the size of 10 stoves or standard size washing machines. Removing a large tree could exceed that amount. If necessary, you can reduce volume by cutting up branches so they lay flat and make the pile compact. Also, once a year, residents are entitled to set out up to 20 cubic yards by calling 3-1-1 a week in advance for a waiver.

BRUSH & BULKY TRASH UPDATE

The City's curbside pickup is the week of the **4th Monday** of the month. (Since the pandemic began, there have sometimes been delays.) By City code, items can be put at the curb no earlier than the Thursday prior to that Monday.
