
- SUPPORT OUR NEIGHBORHOOD SECURITY.

If you are away from home and your house alarm sends an alert, call Smith and their officer can be at your home within minutes, during their patrol hours.
- 4-hour Dallas Police patrols on weekdays.
- All-night armed security patrols by Smith (members know nights & times).
- Police periodically run radar on streets with a high incidence of speeding.
- Members can request added surveillance when out of town.

The **5 Star ENP** ("Expanded Neighborhood Patrol"), south of Forest Lane, is separate from the Hillcrest Forest Neighborhood Association, but we work closely with them. The **Churchill Way ENP**, north of Forest Lane, is managed by the Hillcrest Forest Neighborhood Association. As a paid Hillcrest Forest member in that area, you will receive information on the Churchill Way ENP.

How Police Prioritize Calls



Have you ever wondered why the Dallas Police sometimes take a long time to respond? It's due to priorities and officer availability.

Response times depend on the type of call and whether an officer is available. A 911 call regarding a "suspicious person" is a non-critical Type 4 call. The response time goal is 60 minutes or less. A call about a shooting-in-progress is a Type 1 call with a response time goal of 8 minutes or less. But lower priority calls might still receive a fast response -- IF an officer is available.

FROM PRESIDENT BRUCE WILKE Street Sign Toppers

As you drive around Dallas, you have probably seen the small "street sign toppers" above some corner street signs, naming the neighborhood. This is a City of

Dallas program offered to homeowner associations. The city believes that the signs provide a sense of identity and community. The city doesn't pay for the signs, but it does provide inexpensive installation.

A few months ago, we surveyed a random group of half of our members to see if they liked the idea of "Hillcrest Forest" street sign toppers for our neighborhood. 92% liked the idea.

We did a follow-up survey and offered a variety of sign designs, in both white and green backgrounds. 60% preferred the design below.



The signs will be added at the neighborhood entrances, mostly along Hillcrest Road, Forest Lane, and Royal Lane. The signs will not be obtrusive. They are somewhat smaller than the street signs.

Some residents have already offered to donate, and we would love your help. Just go to our web site, **HillcrestForest.org**, and click the link there. If you can help with a donation, thank you!

The signs cost about \$150 each, and any amount would be appreciated. We believe that we can cover the cost of the project with a combination of resident donations, plus some money from our general fund.

We hope to see the signs installed by the end of this year. Watch for them!

LOSE A DOG? OR FIND ONE?

If you lose a pet and are a paid Member of our association, you can contact us through our web site, **HillcrestForest.org**, and we can usually put out a neighborhood-wide email within hours. This is a service we provide to **members**, so be sure to join or renew!

Also, if you are enrolled at the **NextDoor.com** web site, posting a notice there is another good option. And be sure that your pet is **micro-chipped**, and ask your vet to verify that your contact information in the national database is current!

ASSOCIATION ACTIVITIES IN THE PAST YEAR

You may not always see it, but we've been busy! At our Annual Meeting in May, Hillcrest Forest President Bruce Wilke updated members on our association's activities to improve quality of life in our neighborhood:

- Produced & mailed 2 newsletters & a neighborhood directory.

MICROCHIPS NOW MANDATORY IN DALLAS!

As of June, 2017, all Dallas dogs AND cats over the age of 4 months must be micro-chipped. It is for their protection, so they can be returned to their owners if they are lost.





Microchips are painless -- no larger than a grain of rice.

Your dog or cat can be micro-chipped by any veterinarian, at many mobile clinics, or at Dallas Animal Services for only \$15.00.

Don't take a chance with your pet. Be sure that it is micro-chipped, and ask your vet to verify that your contact information is current in the database.
